



Proposition 39 Clean Energy Workforce Program

The Prop 39 Clean Energy Workforce Project is focused on improving existing community college programs and growing the California Clean Energy LA/OC Consortium to strengthen the regional approach to clean energy workforce development in Los Angeles and Orange Counties.

Grant Period

March 5, 2014 – March 31, 2015.

California Clean Energy LA/OC Consortium

The Consortium will consist of faculty in related programs of study, pathway administrators, workforce partners including WIB representatives, sector navigators, employers, third party credentialers, and other regional partners.

Project Goals

- Prepare workforce to meet green building standards and codes
- Coordinate with sector navigators
- Develop sustainable partnerships
- Elevate quality of instruction
- Incentivize regional cooperation
- Build career pathways
- Enroll all energy related students in CalJOBS

Statutory Authority

Proposition 39 approved by voters on November 6, 2012 general election; enacted into SB 73.

Project Funding

The funding for the project is divided into two categories: Program Operations and Program Improvement.

Program Operations - \$350,000

Los Angeles Trade-Technical College/LACCD are the Fiscal Leads for the LA/Orange County region and are responsible for program operations and the distribution of Program Improvement funds.

- Operational expenses
- Project staffing
- Data collection
- Regional consortia meetings
- Professional development

*** Program Improvement (Oct. 2014)**

Allocated to individual colleges to strengthen existing energy efficiency/clean energy programs. Based on the number of 2013/2014 (July 1, 2013—June 30, 2014) unduplicated energy related student awards. **One unduplicated award per student is allowed.**

Eligible programs and awards per completer:

- Certificates 6 - 17 units—\$ 500
- Certificates or degrees 18+ units—\$1,000
- Completed Journey level apprenticeships—\$1,000
- Third party credentials—\$500

For instructional programs to be eligible for funding, students' certificates or degrees must be listed in the Chancellor's MIS system.
